Application information for international students (undergraduate studies)

Study Programs

We offer five Design and four Art courses that are partially subdivided into specific fields. **You can only apply for one field of study**. Please note: All the study programs are taught in German!

Design Study Programs - Bachelor / 4 years:

1. Industrial Design

Design study programs take 4 years and graduate with a Bachelor degree.

Fine Art Study Programs (5 year - Diploma programs)

- 2. Plastic Arts
 - Figure Sculpture

 - Diploma and Teaching Degree (State Examination)

The study programs Painting/ Graphics and Plastic Arts take five years and graduate with a Diploma of Fine Arts. Art Education studies finish with the Diploma of Art Education.

Concerning the Teaching Degree of Art Education it is necessary to take another subject at the cooperating institution: <u>Martin-Luther-University Halle-Wittenberg</u>. Teaching Degree Studies finish with the German State Examination.

Please note that all our study programs are taught in German!

Admission Requirements

Admission requirements for Bachelor and Diploma studies:

- Successfully passed Entrance Exam of our university (artistic and creative skills)
- **Preliminary Review Documentation (VPD)** through the agency *uni-assist e.V.* Please apply at <u>uni-assist</u> with your school-leaving certificates (university entrance qualification). The agency does evaluate your documents and create a certificate about your university entrance qualification, i.e. whether it is valid to enter studies at a German university. This certificate is the *preliminary review documentation (VPD).* Please submit it in addition with the rest of your documents.
- practical skills and technical know-how, experiences/internship (<u>pre-study internship</u> for all Design Studies, 2 – 6 months, depending on the study program)
- proof of sufficient German language skills

If the equivalence to the German Abitur is not met, a direct admission to the study is not possible. By the attendance of a Studienkolleg (preparatory college) and the passing of the Feststellungsprüfung (assessment test – a supplementary examination to the school-leaving qualifications in your home country) it is possible to acquire the university entrance qualification.

Exceptions are only possible if an exceptional artistic aptitude is stated during the Entrance Exam. For this case, you will also need to hand in the certificate of your preliminary review documentation (*uni-assist*) containing a negative result, i.e. your school-leaving certificate does not meet the requirements to enter a German university.

Application deadlines

The next Entrance Exam will take place in March/April 2026. The beginning of studies is in October 2026.

Usually, study admission is only possible in the winter semester.

Entrance Exam

The Entrance Exam at Burg Giebichenstein takes place once a year during **March/ April**.

On the last page of your online application form you will find important documents and information about the Entrance Exam.

Language skills for the admission of study for applicants without the German Abitur

For a successful study good German language skills are highly important. That is why you have to proof sufficient German language skills. Without sufficient German language skills a direct admission to the study is not possible.

The proof for sufficient German language skills is designated by:

- <u>Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang</u> (DSH) Stufe 2 (DSH2)
- <u>Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache</u> (TestDaF) Stufe 4 (TDN4) in all fields
- <u>Deutsches Sprachdiplom der KMK</u> Stufe 2 (DSD II)
- <u>Goethe-Zertifikat C1</u>
- telc Deutsch C1 Hochschule

It is your responsibility to acquire the necessary language skills until the beginning of your studies.

We advise you to learn German in your home country as well as to take the appropriate exam there. If this is impossible, you have the option to take the DSH and TestDaF exam at the Studienkolleg (preparatory college) at the Martin-Luther University in Halle (Saale). Entry and stay permits

Citizens of the following countries **do not need a visa** for entry:

- European Union as well as Island, Liechtenstein, Norway – for a stay longer than 3 months you have to register at the registration office (Einwohnermeldeamt).
- Swiss, Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Corea, USA, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco and San Marino – the residence permit can be gathered at the relevant immigration authority after entry.

Citizens coming from all other countries need a <u>*Visum für den Aufenthalt zu Studienzwecken*</u> for the purpose of study. You have to apply for this visa after the passed Entrance Exam. For your Visa Application following documents are requested:

- Proof of sufficient <u>health insurance</u>
- <u>Proof of financing</u>
- Proof of your previous academic study courses
- Proof of existing German language knowledge (if applicable) or a planned language course in Germany
- Letter of admission of Burg Giebichenstein or rather the confirmation of the passed Entrance Exam.

The admission of study with a tourist visa is excluded. We strongly advise against an entry with a tourist visa!

Study financing

Burg Giebichenstein University of Arts and Design Halle does not raise any tuition fees. We do not award any scholarships! Please find out about scholarships in your home country, for example on the website of <u>DAAD</u>.

For cost of living during the studies you should calculate about 800 \in per month. The following fix costs occur:

Semester contribution Winter semester 2025/26: 306,8 € (Social contribution for student services 90 € + 8 € Student Union (after the first semester voluntary) + semester ticket for bus and tram 208,8 €)

- Health insurance: citizens of the EU are normally insured with the *European Health Insurance Card*. Non-EU citizens have to take care of their insurance themselves. The matriculation at our university is only possible with a valid health insurance (about 90,00 € per month).
- Living: A reservation of accommodation is not connected with your study place. You can apply for a room at the student's apartment. Renting of students apartments cost up to 290,00 € each month. - Lunch: students can choose from a variety of meals, snacks and drinks offered in our cafeteria, prices around 2,50 €
- Material: Design or Art Studies can be expensive due to the required material! Depending on your field of study high costs may arise.
